House Bill 4545 Accelerated Learning Committees




What is an Accelerated Learning Committee?

The Accelerated Learning Committee is established by school districts to develop an educational plan for <u>students who did not perform satisfactorily</u> on the STAAR test in **grades 3, 5, or 8** math or reading. The committee also provides the student with supplemental accelerated instruction to help the student perform at the appropriate grade level by the conclusion of the school year.



Who is on an Accelerated Learning Committee?

The Accelerated Learning Committee must be comprised of 1.) the **principal or the principal's designee**, 2.) the **student's parent or guardian**, and 3.) the **teacher of the subject of an assessment** on which the student failed to pass. If the student fails an assessment in the same subject in the subsequent school year, the superintendent or a designee must meet with the student's Accelerated Learning Committee.
